REQUIREMENTS FOR STY SCHOLARSHIP**

Scholarship Name: 2023-2024 Inglewood Pacific (CA) Chapter of the Links Services to Youth (STY) Scholarship

Scholarship Description:

The Inglewood Pacific Chapter (IPC) Services to Youth Scholarship is offering financial assistance to qualifying African American female high school students who will graduate in the Spring semester of 2024. Scholarships will be given to African American young ladies who meet the eligibility criteria and show evidence of full time enrollment Course Schedule and Receipt for Tuition Payment in a four-year college or university in Fall 2024. The scholarship awards range from \$1000 - \$2500.

Scholarship Eligibility Requirements:

The applicant must:

- 1) Be an African American/Black female high school graduating senior who lives in and/or attends high school in the Culver City, El Segundo, Inglewood, Marina del Rey, Los Angeles, and Westchester areas;
- 2) Cannot be related to any member in the Inglewood Pacific (CA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated;
- 3) Have a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or 4.0 on a 5.0 scale;
- 4) Student must demonstrate service to the community;
- 5) Student must show evidence of good character and promise;
- 6) Student must have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in extracurricular or other activities.

CRITERIA FOR HBCU SCHOLARSHIP**

Scholarship Name: 2023-2024 HBCU Scholarship

Scholarship Description:

The Inglewood Pacific Chapter (IPC) HBCU Scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior who has been accepted to attend an HBCU college or university. The scholarship is designed to provide annual financial assistance for up to 4 years to a student who meets the criteria described below. Depending upon the amount of funds available, the scholarship may be awarded to one or two students each academic year.

Scholarship Recipient Selection Criteria:

The recipients of the scholarship will be selected through the IPC Services to Youth (STY) Scholarship Committee process.

College or University	Attend a four-year HBCU college or university
Academic Requirement	Must meet the minimum IPC Scholarship Committee criteria. The recipient must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 each of the four years in order to receive subsequent annual scholarship awards.
Financial Status	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Primarily Need Based ● Merit based may be considered in special circumstances when warranted.
Extracurricular Requirements	Involved in volunteer community service projects
Demographics of Candidates	Female African American student
Additional Requirement	Applicants are required to write a one-page essay on the topic "Why I chose to attend an HBCU school."
